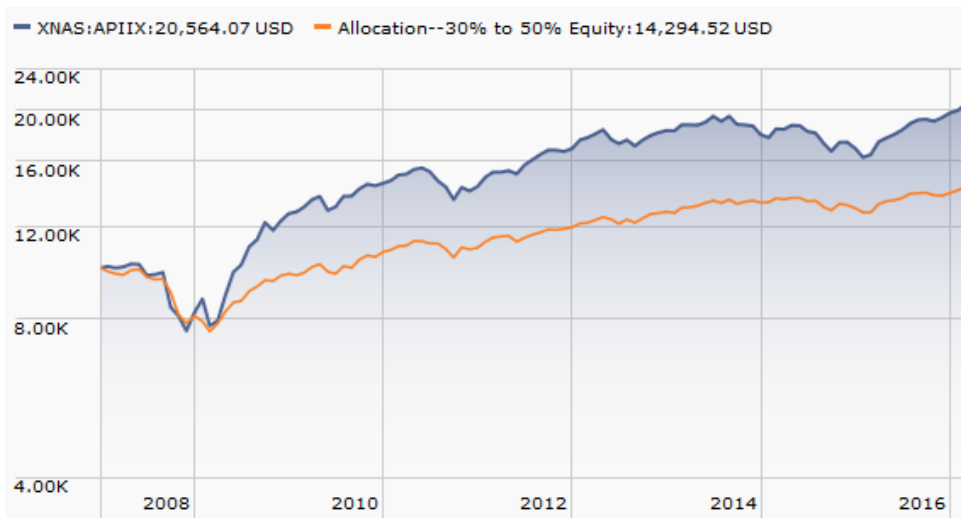


REASONS TO CONSIDER THIS FUND

As of March 31, 2017, the Fund's A and L shares received a 4-star Overall Rating and a 5-star 10 Year Rating in the Allocation-30% to 50% Equity category.

Overall ★★★★★ (4 star) 408 Funds in Category

The Morningstar Rating for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. As of 3/31/2017, the Fund had the following ratings in the Allocation-30% to 50% Equity category for the 3-, 5-, and 10-year periods, respectively: (1) for APIUX: 3 yr, 2 star; 5 yr, 3 stars; 10 yr, 5 stars; Overall, 4 stars; (2) for AFFIX: 3 yr, 1 star; 5 yr, 3 stars; 10 yr, 5 stars; Overall, 4 stars; (3) APIIX: 3 yr, 2 stars; 5 yr, 4 stars; Overall, 3 stars. The number of funds in the category: 3 yr, 408; 5 yr, 350; 10 yr, 243; Overall, 408.
